As we said good bye to 2021, all signs pointed toward a more normal year in 2022. After the last two years of the pandemic, we were all looking forward to sales and shows and be able to plan and attend events which we had missed in 2020 & 2021. Our Spring Sales were held on their traditional dates and did not disappoint at Castle Douglas Sale centre, there were 3 animals over 10,000gns and 12 heifers over 5000gns and at Carlisle sale centre, new male and female record prices were set. This just proves Galloways are very much wanted and people are prepared to pay for them. (Please see reports and photos). As we moved into spring, the weather was unsettled, with an unusually sunny March and a wetter May. The summer shows started and I am delighted to report all the small local shows had a great response from the general public and have reported increased attendance, although not as many animal exhibits as in years before the pandemic. We can't say that about the number and quality of Galloways on show, this has been one of the best exhibits of Galloways seen on the summer show circuit. We would sincerely like to thank all our exhibitors who have taken the time and expense to show their Galloways at both local and national shows. I think everyone will agree it was great to be out and about, meeting with friends, family and customers. The highlight of the summer is the national shows - Royal Highland Show and Great Yorkshire Show, due to the pandemic, the number of general public were restricted each day and this lead to some disappointed people who were unable to source entry tickets, we hope this will be resolved in 2023. Once again we had a great show of Galloways forward, particularly the females and if you want to see the best in the country, please consider attending the Royal Highland Show which is held in the third week in June. All summer we have been blessed with warm, dry weather, in the heart of Galloway we have been lucky, rain has come at all the right times, other parts of the UK have not been so fortunate. England particularly the South East, had hot spells each month, and the summer will be remembered for a new UK record of 40.3 °C at Coningsby (Lincolnshire)

on July 19th. The weather was settled for much of the time, with little rain in many areas during most of July and early August. Sunshine was above average with rainfall 50% less than average. Many farmers in the South have been feeding winter crops since July and will no doubt worry if they will have enough rations to see the winter out, let's hope for an early spring.

As we enter the Autumn, it's not just the weather that is causing concern, which has been warm and wet, we now have our third Prime Minter since September and the cost of living crisis is making a major impact in all our lives. For farmers, it's the three "F"s - Fuel, Fertiliser (up 152%) and Feed (wheat up 52%) that is impacting on our bottom line, which in turn makes food more expensive for the British public. In the UK, we are experiencing industrial strikes and the threat of electrical black outs as inflation hits double figures 10.1% - the highest it has been since 1982.

Trade was a flyer at the Galloway Cattle Society's two day show and sale held at Walleys Marts, Castle Douglas, with three animals over 10,000gns and a dozen heifers over 5000gns

Selling the lead price of 15000gns for Kirkstead Elite was Society's Chairman, Alan McClymont, Kirkstead, Yarrow, this much fancied 16 month old is by Troloss Impeccable who was purchased in partnership with David and Rosemarie Cornthwaite, Balgray for 9200gns. Elite was placed 2nd in the show the previous day and is off home with Klondyke Farms Ltd, Shancastle, Moniaive, Thornhill for their 100 head herd.

10000gns was achieved twice, once for the Male Champion, Unthank Beowulf from Alistair Busby, Unthank, Ewes, Langholm, this March 2020 was the heaviest bull in the mart at 832kgs, he is by 3500gns Mandella of Balgray and was purchased by Messrs Spours & Sons, Twizell Farm, Belford, Northumberland for their 70 cow herd.

Ben Lomond Endeavour from J.M & D Maxwell, Blairvockie, Drymen, Glasgow also realized 10,000gns, this May 2020 is a Zonda of Kilnstown son and out of Ben Lomond Waterlily - a Klondyke Raider daughter was sold to Father and Son team, John and Andrew Tullie, Bowanhill, Teviothead,

Selkirk. Duncan Maxwell also purchased one of three animals to achieve 8000gns - Barlaes Trooper, from Judge - Robert McTurk, Barlaes, Dalry, Castle Douglas, this 22 month old Troless Magnum son is out of Barlaes Nancy 126th who is by the homebred sire Barlaes Colossus.

Doug and Jim Ross, Romesebeoch, Shawhead, Dumfries, sold the first bull in the ring - Chopper of Romeseoch also for 8000gns, this October 2019 born, Struthurr Yogi son sold to repeat customer Jimmy Ions, Thornyburn, Falstone, Hexham.

8000gns was the female top price for Brownie 5th of Finland, from Jimmy Wallace and Family at Finland, Dalry, Castle Douglas, placed 2nd in its class the day before, this Kirkstead Vindicator daughter who was shared with Kirkstead sold to Mr. Steven McKillop, Sallachry East, Inveraray.

The Finland Team had a great day in the office, as they sold 6 Kirkstead Vindicator daughters heifers to average 5000gns. Their next best top price of 6500gns was for the first prize heifer Joyce 3rd of Finland, out of Joyce 1st of Finland who is the AI sire Orinocho of Over Barskeoch, she went home with R. Nixon & E. MacPherson, Marbrack, Carsphairn, Castle Douglas. A calf of 6000gns was made for the incalf heifer - Brownie 7th of Finland, this August 2019 heifer is travelling home with Helen Ryman, North Kildarroch, Whauphill, Newton Stewart. Helen also purchased Kathleen 15th of Finland for 3200gns, Brownie 8th of Finland - full sister to the top price heifer for 2200gns and Lady Polka 16th of Finland for 4200gns.

The Female champion was Foxglove Blue of Nether Cleugh from Peter Hunter Blair, Nether Cleugh, Corsock, this September 2019 born Blackcraig Vagabond daughter was sold in calf to Nether Cleugh's new stock bull Klondyke Domino was purchased by June and Bobby Mackenzie, Wester Auchnagallen, Grantown of Spey for 7000gns, which is Nether Cleugh best price to date.

The reserve female champion, Blackcraig Blondchen B1089 from John, Ann & Iain Finlay, Blackcraig, Corsock secured 6500gns to Messrs Cowie, Polston Farm, The Mill, Polston. This first place heifer is by the homebred bull Blackcraig Superman and out of Blackcraig Blondchen U 087 who goes back to Blackcraig Sam. This stylish heifer was one of five heifers from the much admired pen from Blackcraig which averaged 3900gns. The next best priced heifer was 5000gns for Blackcraig Shields B1070 by Nucamp of Balgray and out of Blackcraig Shields and heads north to Stirling with new members 3G Galloways. Reinstating the Galloways at Crossdykes, Lockerbie, well known Limousin breeder J. Common & Sons, purchased another Nucamp of Balgray daughter -Blackcraig Bertha B1045 for 4500gns. German breeder Horst Kraft then secured Blackcraig Moss Rose B1091 for the next best price of 4200gns and Blackcraig Blonchen B1089 sold for 3800gns to G & M Porter, Islay. Blackcraig's only bull entry - Blackcraig Crofter, a Blackcraig Xtream son sold for 7000gns sold in a half share deal between Messrs Milligan, Dunesslin, Dunscore, Dumfries and Messrs Wallace, Over Barskeoch, Dalry, Castle Douglas.

Mr. Robert McTurk, Barlaes said "The Galloway breed is all about producing easily sustainable, highly, productive females." There was plenty of quality on show and the heifers in particular were a joy to judge.

Carlisle Spring Show and Sale Friday 4th March, 2022

Two new center breed records were achieved for both male and female at the spring show and sale in Carlisle Mart.

The female record was achieved by the 1st place junior bulling heifer - i.e. 255th from Robert McTurk, Barlaes, Castle Douglas, this 23 month old heifer is by Troloss Magnum who was originally bought in half share for 11k from Troloss and then took up full share following Troloss dispersal. 2022 sees the first crop of calves sold with bulls to 8000gns and averaging 6500gns for 3 at Castle Douglas sale centre. She sold to Mr. Robbie Galloway, Cardona, Doune for 4000gns. Mr. Galloway also purchased the champion female again from Robert McTurk - Barlaes Brownie 254th, another nearly two year old heifer again by Troloss Magnum and out of the Brownie family which goes back to a home bred bull Barlaes JFK, she sold for 2000gns.

Husband and wife team Richard and Alison Maxwell, Howside, Ennerdale, Cleator, Cumbria achieved the new centre record price for Knight of Ennerdale, this is the first bull to be sold by Troloss Matrix who was purchased at the 2019 Castle Douglas sale for 15000gns and out of Kalinka 1461 of Romesbeoch - purchased for 2400gns at the 2015 Castle Douglas sale. This 19 month old bull, who stood 2nd in his class sold for 6000gns in a half share deal to J & A Finlay, Blackcraig, Corsock and R.A. McClymont, Kirkstead, Yarrow.

The champion bull – Viking of Whitehill from Walter and Iain Henderson, Whitehill, Lockerbie, is by 5000gns Everest of Gall-way who's son - Ace of Whitehill sold for 4300gns at the 2021 spring sale. This 26 month old bull is out of Lizzie 401 of Whitehill, sold to Messrs TD & M Moore & Son, Soffley Farm, Slaggyford for 2200gns. The Henderson Family also sold a personal female best price of 3100gns for Lady Nancy 818 of Whitehill, this March 2019 in calf heifer by the home bred Trojan of Whithill sold to Mr. R.
